WHĀNAU ORA

Whānau Ora puts whānau and families in control of the services they need to work together, build on their strengths and achieve their aspirations. It recognises the collective strength and capability of whānau to achieve better outcomes in areas such as health, education, housing, employment and income levels.

Our training aims to prepare kaimahi working with whānau in the community, (not only Whānau Ora Navigators, but all those working with whānau), to be armed with the best possible skills and knowledge to support whānau to achieve their aspirations.

NZ CERTIFICATE IN WHĀNAU ORA (LEVEL 4)

The NZ Certificate in Whānau Ora is delivered in six 3-day wānanga over 6 months (Wed-Fri). Pūkenga Mātauranga (Guest Speakers), who are highly qualified and respected in their field of expertise, present relevant, engaging information alongside passionate pouako. Taura will be assessed with NZQA unit standards and modules, utilising a variety of assessment methods.

Graduate Outcomes

Graduates will:

- Be better prepared to work alongside whānau, to understand and work with strengths.
- Have a good understanding of their community and the services available to whānau, and how to access them.
- Demonstrate a clear understanding of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and its impact and relevance in current society.
- Gain an increased understanding of systems and processes within community services with a view to better assisting whānau to access and navigate these services.
- Gain a clear understanding of the Whānau Ora framework and how this supports whānau aspirations.
- Be able to develop a whānau plan, record observations and assessments, and evaluate success.
- Develop presentation skills.
- Be able to evaluate own practice, identify own strengths and weaknesses.

Entry Criteria

- Basic computer skills as you will be required to access Google Classroom (prior knowledge of Google Classroom is not required);
- Minimum of 18 years of age and a NZ citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident.

Fees & Subsidies

Employees of DHB funded organisations may be eligible for a training grant for which the individual must make application directly through their local DHB. Taura may also be eligible for a TEC training subsidy through Tipu Ora. These are subject to criteria and availability.
